SIDEWALK IMPROVEMENTS COMING

The Oak Hills Homeowners Board has targeted several of our sidewalk corners for safety improvements. A Sidewalk Committee was formed in May. Its first task was to evaluate all of the corners and sidewalks in the neighborhood and identify those corner ramps that were in greatest need of repair due to possible trip-hazards caused by the cracking, settling or uplifting of concrete.

Several contractors have been interviewed who will be presenting bids. In addition, since the corner ramps interface with the public roadways and because of safety requirements associated with the Americans with Disabilities Act, the Monterey County Department of Public Works needs to be involved for both planning and permit purposes. This is not a project that the association can "just hire someone to go out and fill the cracks with concrete." The outlined work requires that the board proceed methodically through a prescribed process, and that will take some time. Stay tuned for further developments.

THE COMMUNITY NEEDS YOUR HELP

You may have noticed several homes in the community recently sold and several more are still on the market. The proximity to major highways, beautiful natural areas, and other amenities make our community a desirable option for prospective home buyers. Dead trees - Dead or dying trees and plants should be removed and replaced...

Trash removal - Trash cans, building supplies, and other unsightly debris should not be stored in sight of the street or placed where it detracts from a neighbor's view. Do not discard wastes off any kind onto the greenbelt or other areas.

The overall appearance of properties in the community can have a significant impact on home values and homebuyer interest. We all have a big investment in our community, so please help maintain our property values.

WHY WE HIRED AN ARBORIST

As Oak Hills residents, we already know and appreciate this beautiful environment we are fortunate to live within. Our surrounding "greenbelt" is an enhancement to the value of our personal property and a source of great comfort and escape to those who regularly walk through our surrounding forest and grasslands. John Muir once remarked of the woodland walk that it is "the clearest way into the universe" and promised that when we go to wild areas "Nature's peace will flow into you as sunshine flows into trees."

But now that many of our trees are at or nearing maturity, how do we best preserve and maintain our woodland while minimizing the potential liability of dangerous trees and ensure the safety of our residents and their property, especially during this serious drought and fire season. Realizing our responsibility and special location within the Monterey County Coastal District, the OHHA Board has taken pro-active steps to address these issues as recommended by our liability insurance company.

First a tree committee walked the greenbelt and listed the locations and variety of 101 potentially vulnerable trees. Then we sought proposals from several locally recognized arborists to assist us in the preparation of a tree risk management plan. After much deliberation the board selected Thompson Wildland Management, an environmental management and conservation service. By the end of August a certified arborist will have prepared a tree management plan for our greenbelt areas that will locate, number and assess each designated tree for potential risk, using a tree hazard evaluation form as needed and suggesting steps to mitigate identified problems. This may include trimming, pruning or sometimes removal of dangerous trees.

The assessment of tree-associated risk requires specific training and familiarity with the legal permit processes, various types of trees and their locations. While employed by OHHA, a professional forester will assemble the tree data collected into a useable environment management plan that can assist us in planning for maintenance, protection and prevention of future environmental risk. The OHHA board recognizes that taking care of our community property including the trees and wildlife that share our surroundings, is an investment for all of us.

SUPPORT AND ENJOY OUR CASTROVILLE LIBRARY

Monterey County Free Libraries operates seventeen branch libraries which includes our Castroville Library, two bookmobiles, a library by mail program, deposit collections in local schools, and a number of special programs, including a literacy program which operates a literacy outreach vehicle focused on family literacy and kindergarten readiness. Our Homework Centers, sponsored by the Foundation for the Monterey County Free Libraries, provide a FREE place for students of all ages to complete their schoolwork. Print and computer resources, including Internet access, Electronic Databases and word processing, are available for use. They have an open door policy, just drop-in and sign up with the Homework Center Coordinator. Read to a Dog? Grade school students can practice their reading with Walker, a therapy dog, and Linda, a retired teacher, every Saturday morning from 11am to 12pm.
